SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of necessary first-aid measures:

Request medical assistance immediately, showing the SDS of this product.

By inhalation:

Remove the person affected from the area of exposure, provide fresh air and keep at rest. Dust may cause mild irritation. Seek medical attention if symptoms persist.

By skin contact:

Remove contaminated clothing, wash skin thoroughly with water and soap. Seek medical attention if irritation persists.

By eye contact:

Rinse eyes thoroughly with lukewarm water for at least 15 minutes, holding eyelids open. Remove contact lenses if present and easy to do. Seek medical attention if irritation persists.

By ingestion/aspiration:

Rinse out the mouth with water. Give water to drink if the person is conscious. Seek medical attention if a large amount has been swallowed or if symptoms occur.

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1 Suitable extinguishing media:
Suitable: Water spray/fog, foam, carbon dioxide, dry chemical powder
Unsuitable: None known

5.2 Specific hazards arising from the chemical:
Combustible solid; finely divided dust dispersed in air may form an explosible dust cloud in confined spaces (e.g. mills, dryers, silos) if an ignition source is present.

5.3 Special protective actions for fire-fighters:
Evacuate all non-essential personnel. Intervention only by capable personnel who are trained and aware of the hazards of the product. In all cases wear self-contained breathing apparatus. When intervention in close proximity, wear full protective chemical-resistant suit. After intervention, proceed to clean the equipment (take a shower, remove clothing carefully, clean and check).

Additional provisions:
Cool fire-exposed containers/packaging with water spray from a safe distance. Avoid generating dust clouds near ignition sources during fire-fighting.

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

6.1 Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:

For non-emergency personnel:
Avoid generating dust. Sweep up spilled material into containers, provided there is no additional risk. Use appropriate PPE (see section 8).

For emergency responders:
Wear protective equipment. Keep unprotected persons away. See section 8.

6.2 Environmental precautions:
Avoid release to drains, watercourses or soil in large quantities (can lower pH locally). Notify the relevant authority in case of significant environmental release.

SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

7.1 Precautions for safe handling:

- A. General precautions for safe use:**
Avoid generating and inhaling dust; use local exhaust ventilation/dust extraction for milling, grinding or transfer operations. Avoid contact with eyes.
- B. Technical recommendations for the prevention of fires and explosions:**
Control dust concentrations and eliminate ignition sources in areas where dust clouds may form (e.g. bulk handling, milling); use appropriately rated (dust-ignition-proof) electrical equipment where applicable.
