SECTION 2: HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

2.1 Classification of the substance or mixture:

GHS:
Aluminium sulphate does not carry a harmonised GHS classification. Based on the source safety data and well-established public classification data (industry self-classification notifications for this CAS number), the product is classified as follows:

Eye Irrit. 2	Eye irritation, Category 2, H319
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The solid/anhydrous material itself is not classified as flammable, explosive, oxidising or corrosive (not a Dangerous Good for transport – see Section 14). In aqueous solution the product is mildly acidic and can cause irritation on prolonged or repeated contact.

2.3 Other hazards which do not result in classification:

Dust from the solid may irritate the nose, mouth and eyes. Hydrolyses in water to release sulphuric acid in trace quantity, which may corrode metals in the presence of moisture.

SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of necessary first-aid measures:

Request medical assistance if symptoms persist, showing the SDS of this product.

By inhalation:

Remove the affected person to fresh air. Rinse nose and mouth with water. Seek medical aid if coughing or irritation persists.

By skin contact:

Flush the affected area with plenty of water and soap. Remove contaminated clothing. Seek medical aid if irritation develops.

Flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes, holding eyelids open. Seek medical aid immediately.

4.2 Most important symptoms/effects, acute and delayed:

Dust irritates nose, mouth, eyes and skin. Ingestion of large doses causes gastric irritation, nausea, vomiting and purging.

4.3 Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment needed, if necessary:

Not relevant. Treat symptomatically.

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

- 5.1 Suitable extinguishing media:**
Suitable: Product is non-combustible – use extinguishing media appropriate for the surrounding fire (water spray/fog, foam, dry chemical powder, CO₂).

Non-flammable, non-explosive, will not undergo hazardous polymerization. Emits toxic fumes of sulphur oxides (SOx) and sodium/aluminium oxides on strong heating or in fire.

11.1 Information on toxicological effects:
