SECTION 2: HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

2.1 Classification of the substance or mixture:

GHS:
Based on available data, the classification criteria of the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals (GHS) are not met. This product is not classified as hazardous.

2.3 Other hazards which do not result in classification:

Note: barium sulfate is distinguished from soluble barium salts (e.g. barium chloride, barium carbonate), which ARE acutely toxic – its extreme insolubility in water and body fluids is why it is not classified and is even used as a radiographic contrast medium in medicine.

SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of necessary first-aid measures:

Request medical assistance immediately, showing the SDS of this product.

By inhalation:

Remove the person affected from the area of exposure to fresh air and keep at rest. If dust has been inhaled and irritation or breathing difficulty persists, seek medical attention.

By skin contact:

Remove contaminated clothing and footwear. Wash affected skin thoroughly with plenty of water and soap. If irritation develops or persists, seek medical attention.

By eye contact:

Rinse eyes thoroughly with lukewarm water for at least 15 minutes, holding eyelids open. Remove contact lenses if present and easy to do. Seek medical attention if irritation persists.

By ingestion/aspiration:

Rinse mouth with water. Do NOT induce vomiting. If conscious, give plenty of water to drink. Seek medical attention immediately, especially if large quantities were ingested.

4.2 Most important symptoms/effects, acute and delayed:

4.3 Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment needed, if necessary:

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1 Suitable extinguishing media:

Suitable: Not combustible – use extinguishing media suited to the surrounding fire (water spray, foam, dry chemical powder, CO2).

Unsuitable: None known.

5.2 Specific hazards arising from the chemical:

Non-combustible, non-explosive. Does not support combustion.

5.3 Special protective actions for fire-fighters:

No special measures required beyond those for the surrounding fire.

Additional provisions:

If safe to do so, remove exposed containers from the fire area. Use water spray to cool fire-exposed containers/structures. Avoid generating and inhaling dust.

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

6.1 Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:

For non-emergency personnel:

Avoid raising and inhaling dust. Use personal protective equipment as described in Section 8. Evacuate the area and keep unprotected persons away.

For emergency responders:

Wear appropriate protective equipment as described in Section 8. Ensure adequate ventilation.

6.2 Environmental precautions:

Practically insoluble and of very low toxicity; nonetheless avoid large-scale release to watercourses as physical/turbidity impact on aquatic habitats.

6.3 Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up:

Sweep up or vacuum spilled material (avoid generating dust) and place in a suitable closed, labelled container for recovery or disposal. Wash the spill area with water after solid material has been removed.

SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

7.1 Precautions for safe handling:

A. General precautions for safe use:

Avoid generating and breathing dust during bulk handling. Keep away from incompatible materials (see section 10).

B. Technical recommendations for the prevention of fires and explosions:

Product is non-combustible; no special fire-prevention measures required.

C. Technical recommendations on general occupational hygiene:

Do not eat, drink or smoke during handling. Wash hands and exposed skin thoroughly after handling and before breaks/meals.

D. Technical recommendations to prevent environmental risks:

Avoid release to the environment. Follow the protective measures given in Section 8. For bulk storage/handling, consult Suraj Chemicals.

Chemically inert and unreactive under normal conditions. Reduced to barium sulfide by strong reducing agents at high temperature.

SECTION 11: TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

11.1 Information on toxicological effects:
In case of exposure that is repetitive, prolonged, or at concentrations higher than the recommended occupational exposure limits, adverse health effects may result depending on the means of exposure:

Practically non-toxic due to extreme insolubility; barium sulfate is used medically as an oral/rectal radiographic contrast agent under controlled conditions.
- B. Inhalation (acute effect):**
Dust may cause mechanical/nuisance irritation of the respiratory tract; prolonged excessive dust inhalation may contribute to baritosis (a benign pneumoconiosis) – use standard dust controls.
- C. Contact with skin and eyes (acute effect):**
May cause mild mechanical irritation to eyes; not expected to irritate skin.
- D. CMR effects (carcinogenicity, mutagenicity, reproductive toxicity):**
Classification criteria for carcinogenicity, mutagenicity and reproductive toxicity are not met based on available data. IARC: Not listed.
- E. Sensitizing effects:**
Classification criteria for respiratory or skin sensitisation are not met based on available data.
- F. Specific target organ toxicity (STOT) – single exposure:**
Classification criteria are not met based on available data, except as noted in Section 2.
