Uses advised against: Not for direct use as a finished disinfectant/biocidal product without appropriate dilution, formulation and regulatory (biocide) registration. All uses not specified in this section or in section 7.3.

3.2 Mixtures:

See composition table above – this product is an aqueous quaternary ammonium surfactant solution (mixture).

SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of necessary first-aid measures:

Take off immediately all contaminated clothing. Self-protection of the first aider is advised – wear appropriate PPE before assisting.

By inhalation:

Remove the person affected to fresh air and keep at rest. Seek immediate medical attention if breathing difficulty or irritation occurs.

By skin contact:

Wash immediately and thoroughly with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Remove contaminated clothing while rinsing. Seek medical attention.

By eye contact:

Flush immediately with plenty of water for at least 15 – 20 minutes, holding eyelids apart. Remove contact lenses if present and easy to do. Seek immediate medical/ophthalmological attention.

By ingestion/aspiration:

Do NOT induce vomiting. Rinse mouth with water (only if the person is conscious). Seek immediate medical attention – risk of chemical burns to mouth, throat, oesophagus and stomach.

4.2 Most important symptoms/effects, acute and delayed:

Skin contact: may cause severe irritation/burns with prolonged or concentrated contact. Eye contact: causes serious eye damage – redness, pain, blurred vision, possible corneal injury. Ingestion: harmful if swallowed; corrosive to mouth, throat and oesophagus at this concentration; nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain. Inhalation of mist: irritation of the respiratory tract, coughing.

4.3 Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment needed, if necessary:

Treat symptomatically. Do not attempt to neutralise chemically in the eye or on the skin. Show this SDS to the treating physician.

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1 Suitable extinguishing media:

**Suitable:** Water spray, foam, dry chemical powder, carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) – select extinguishing media suited to the surrounding fire.

**Unsuitable:** None known

5.2 Specific hazards arising from the chemical:

Aqueous solution – does not burn readily. Not classified as flammable. Thermal decomposition may generate irritant/toxic fumes including hydrogen chloride, oxides of nitrogen and carbon.

5.3 Special protective actions for fire-fighters:

Fight fire from a safe distance/protected location. Wear self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing when involved in a fire. Cool fire-exposed containers with water spray.

Additional provisions:

Do not allow fire-fighting water to enter drains, surface water or ground water – contain and dispose of as contaminated waste.

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

6.1 Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:

For non-emergency personnel:

Wear suitable protective equipment (see Section 8) to prevent contamination of skin, eyes and personal clothing. Note that spilled material may be slippery underfoot.

For emergency responders:

Wear protective equipment described in Section 8. Keep unprotected persons away.

6.2 Environmental precautions:

Keep away from drains, surface water and ground water. Retain and dispose of contaminated washing/rinse water as waste; avoid uncontrolled discharge, as the product will foam and is harmful to aquatic life.

6.3 Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up:

Contain the spill. Absorb with an inert absorbent material (sand, earth, diatomaceous earth, vermiculite) or flush with plenty of water to a contained/treated effluent system if permitted. Collect with a clean shovel, place in suitable closed containers, and remove for disposal. Wash the affected area thoroughly.

SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

7.1 Precautions for safe handling:

A. General precautions for safe use:

Provide adequate ventilation. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Handle open containers with care – spilled material is slippery.

B. Technical recommendations for the prevention of fires and explosions:

Not applicable – product is an aqueous, non-flammable solution. Keep containers tightly closed.

C. Technical recommendations on general occupational hygiene:

Do not eat, drink or smoke in work areas. Wash hands and exposed skin before breaks and after work.

D. Technical recommendations to prevent environmental risks:

Prevent release to drains, surface water and groundwater. See subsection 6.2.

B. General conditions for storage:

Store away from strong oxidising agents, anionic surfactants/detergents (incompatible and mutually inactivating) and strong acids/alkalis. Store in corrosion-resistant (e.g. HDPE, glass-lined, stainless steel) containers, away from food and feed. For additional information see subsection 10.5.

7.3 Specific end use(s):

No additional information available beyond the uses listed in Section 1.2.

SECTION 8: EXPOSURE CONTROLS / PERSONAL PROTECTION

8.1 Control parameters:

Benzalkonium Chloride (CAS 8001-54-5): no specific occupational exposure limit established under the Factories Act, 1948 or other Indian regulations.

8.2 Appropriate engineering controls:

Provide sufficient general/local ventilation as a collective protection measure, in addition to individual PPE as needed.

B. Respiratory protection:

Avoid breathing mist/spray. Use a suitable respirator with organic vapour/particulate cartridge if mist is generated in poorly ventilated areas or during spray application.

C. Specific protection for the hands:

Wear suitable chemical-resistant gloves (e.g. nitrile or natural rubber, minimum thickness 0.4–0.65 mm).

D. Eye and face protection:

Use chemical safety goggles with side protection; wear a face shield where splashing may occur.

E. Bodily protection:

Wear suitable protective clothing and chemical-resistant footwear/apron for prolonged or repeated contact.

F. Additional emergency measures:

Emergency shower and eyewash stations should be available near the work area.

SECTION 10: STABILITY AND REACTIVITY

- 10.1 Reactivity:**  
Incompatible with anionic surfactants/detergents (mutual inactivation/precipitation), strong oxidising agents and strong acids/alkalis.
- 10.2 Chemical stability:**  
Stable under normal conditions of storage and handling. May precipitate/gel at low temperature; re-warm and mix gently to redissolve.
- 10.3 Possibility of hazardous reactions:**  
Hazardous polymerisation will not occur.

- 10.5 Incompatible materials:**  
Anionic surfactants/detergents, soaps, strong oxidising agents, strong acids and alkalis, and oxidising metal salts.
- 10.6 Hazardous decomposition products:**  
None under normal use and storage conditions. Thermal decomposition may release hydrogen chloride, oxides of nitrogen and oxides of carbon.

SECTION 11: TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

- 11.1 Information on toxicological effects:**  
In case of exposure that is repetitive, prolonged, or at concentrations higher than recommended, adverse health effects may result depending on the means of exposure:
- A. Ingestion (acute effect):**  
Harmful if swallowed. At this concentration, corrosive to the mouth, throat, oesophagus and stomach; may cause nausea, vomiting and abdominal pain.
- B. Inhalation (acute effect):**  
Mist/spray may cause irritation of the nose, throat and respiratory tract; not normally an inhalation hazard for the liquid as supplied.
- C. Contact with skin and eyes (acute effect):**  
Causes severe skin burns. Causes serious eye damage.
- D. CMR effects (carcinogenicity, mutagenicity, reproductive toxicity):**  
Not classified as a germ cell mutagen, carcinogen, or reproductive toxicant based on available data.
- E. Sensitizing effects:**  
Not classified as a respiratory sensitiser; skin sensitisation classification criteria not met based on available data, though quaternary ammonium compounds may cause contact dermatitis in sensitive individuals with repeated exposure.
- F. Specific target organ toxicity (STOT) – single/repeated exposure:**  
Not classified based on available data.
- H. Aspiration hazard:**  
Not classified based on available data.

12.2 Persistence and degradability:

Biodegradability is limited by the compound's antimicrobial (biocidal) action; not considered readily biodegradable under standard test conditions.

12.3 Bioaccumulative potential:

Some potential for bioaccumulation in aquatic organisms is reported in the literature for long-chain quaternary ammonium compounds. Not established for this specific grade.

12.4 Mobility in soil:

Cationic surfactant – strongly adsorbs to soil, sediment and organic matter (low mobility). No further data available.

12.5 Results of PBT and vPvB assessment:

Not formally assessed for this grade.

12.6 Other adverse effects:

Toxic to a wide range of micro-organisms, algae and aquatic invertebrates by virtue of its antimicrobial mode of action; avoid any release to sewers/effluent treatment systems relying on biological treatment.

SECTION 13: DISPOSAL CONSIDERATIONS

13.1 Disposal methods:

Do not empty into drains; avoid uncontrolled release to the environment. Classified as hazardous waste due to corrosivity and aquatic toxicity at this concentration. Dispose of via a licensed waste disposal contractor in accordance with the Hazardous and Other Wastes (Management and Transboundary Movement) Rules, 2016 and applicable local, state and central regulations.

Contaminated packaging should be emptied as completely as possible and may then be handled in the same way as the product; uncleaned packaging should be disposed of as hazardous/industrial waste.
