SECTION 2: HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

2.1 Classification of the substance or mixture:

SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of necessary first-aid measures:

By inhalation:

Remove person to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Dust/fumes (SO₂) may cause coughing and breathing difficulty, particularly in asthmatic or sulfite-sensitive individuals. Get medical

attention if symptoms persist.

By skin contact:

Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected skin thoroughly with plenty of water. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

By eye contact:

Rinse cautiously with water for at least 15 minutes, removing contact lenses if present and easy to do. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

By ingestion:

Rinse mouth with water. Do not induce vomiting. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Get medical attention – contact with stomach acid liberates sulfur dioxide gas.

4.2 Most important symptoms/effects, acute and delayed:

Irritation of eyes, skin and respiratory tract. Sulfite-sensitive/asthmatic individuals may experience severe respiratory reactions (bronchospasm) even at low exposure.

4.3 Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment needed, if necessary:

Treat symptomatically.

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1 Suitable extinguishing media:

Suitable: Use extinguishing media suitable for the surrounding fire (water spray, dry chemical, CO₂, foam).

Unsuitable: None known.

5.2 Specific hazards arising from the chemical:

Non-combustible. On heating or contact with acids, decomposes to release toxic sulfur dioxide (SO₂) gas.

5.3 Special protective actions for fire-fighters:

Wear self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing.

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

6.1 Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:

Avoid generating dust. Ensure adequate ventilation. Avoid contact with acids. Use PPE as per section 8.

6.2 Environmental precautions:

Do not discharge to drains, surface water or soil. Contain spillage.

6.3 Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up:

Sweep up and collect in a suitable, clearly labeled container for disposal or reuse. Avoid raising dust. Wash the spill site with water after material pick-up.

SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

7.1 Precautions for safe handling:

Avoid generating and breathing dust. Keep away from acids and strong oxidizing agents. Use with adequate local exhaust ventilation. Wash hands thoroughly after handling.

7.2 Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities:

Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated place in tightly closed containers, protected from moisture (hygroscopic; slowly oxidises to sulfate in moist air). Keep away from acids and oxidizing agents.

7.3 Specific end use(s):

Food-grade material is intended for use as a permitted food preservative/antioxidant (E224) at the levels prescribed by applicable food regulations.

Provide local exhaust ventilation to control dust and any liberated SO₂ below exposure limits.

B. Respiratory protection:

Respirator with particulate/acid-gas (SO₂) cartridge if dust or fumes are generated or exposure limits are exceeded.

C. Specific protection for the hands:

Chemical-resistant protective gloves.

D. Eye and face protection:

Chemical safety goggles.

E. Bodily protection:

Protective clothing; safety shower and eyewash station should be available.

SECTION 10: STABILITY AND REACTIVITY

10.1 Reactivity:

Reacts with acids to liberate toxic sulfur dioxide gas. Slowly oxidises in moist air to potassium sulfate.

10.2 Chemical stability:

Stable when stored dry, cool and tightly closed. Hygroscopic.

10.3 Possibility of hazardous reactions:

Contact with acids or strong oxidizers can generate SO₂ gas and heat.

10.4 Conditions to avoid:

SECTION 11: TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

11.1 Information on toxicological effects:

A. Ingestion (acute effect):

Harmful if swallowed (H302). May cause gastrointestinal irritation; contact with stomach acid liberates sulfur dioxide gas.

B. Inhalation (acute effect):

May cause respiratory tract irritation (H335). Sulfite-sensitive and asthmatic individuals may experience severe reactions at even low exposure levels.

C. Contact with skin and eyes (acute effect):

Causes skin irritation (H315) and serious eye irritation (H319).

D. CMR effects (carcinogenicity, mutagenicity, reproductive toxicity):

Classification criteria are not met based on available data.

E. Sensitizing effects:

Not classified as a skin/respiratory sensitizer under GHS criteria; however, sulfites are a recognised cause of allergic-type (non-IgE) reactions in sensitive individuals.
