SECTION 2: HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

2.1 Classification of the substance or mixture:

GHS:
Classification of this product has been carried out in accordance with the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals (GHS), based on the source safety data for sodium bisulphate (very hazardous in case of skin/eye contact, corrosive) and the well-established public classification for this substance family:

SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of necessary first-aid measures:

Request medical assistance immediately, showing the SDS of this product.

By inhalation:

Remove to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention.

By skin contact:

Immediately flush skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. Wash clothing before reuse; clean shoes thoroughly before reuse. Get medical attention immediately.

By eye contact:

Check for and remove any contact lenses. Immediately flush eyes with running water for at least 15 minutes, keeping eyelids open. Do not use an eye ointment. Seek medical attention.

By ingestion/aspiration:

Do not induce vomiting. Loosen tight clothing. If not breathing, perform artificial respiration. Seek immediate medical attention. WARNING: mouth-to-mouth resuscitation may be hazardous to the person providing aid when the ingested material is corrosive.

4.2 Most important symptoms/effects, acute and delayed:

Eye contact can result in corneal damage or blindness. Skin contact can produce inflammation and blistering. Inhalation of dust produces irritation of the respiratory tract characterized by burning, sneezing and coughing. Severe over-exposure can produce lung damage.

4.3 Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment needed, if necessary:

Treat as a corrosive material and symptomatically.

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1 Suitable extinguishing media:

Suitable: Product is non-flammable; use extinguishing media appropriate for the surrounding fire.
Unsuitable: None known.

5.2 Specific hazards arising from the chemical:

Non-flammable. No specific fire or explosion hazard known.

5.3 Special protective actions for fire-fighters:

Wear appropriate protective equipment and self-contained breathing apparatus for surrounding fires.

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

6.1 Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:

For non-emergency personnel:

Small spill: use appropriate tools to place the spilled solid in a convenient waste disposal container, avoiding dust generation.

For emergency responders:

Large spill: corrosive solid – stop leak if without risk. Do not touch spilled material. Use water spray to reduce dust/vapours. Prevent entry into sewers, basements or confined areas; dike if needed.

6.2 Environmental precautions:

Prevent contamination of drains, watercourses and soil.

6.3 Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up:

Sweep up avoiding dust generation and place in a suitable container for disposal or recovery. Do not add water directly to the concentrated product.

SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

7.1 Precautions for safe handling:

A. General precautions for safe use:

Do not ingest. Do not breathe dust. Never add water to this product (add product to water if dilution is required, with care). Avoid contact with skin and eyes.

B. Technical recommendations for the prevention of fires and explosions:

Not applicable – product is non-combustible.

C. Technical recommendations on general occupational hygiene:

Wash hands thoroughly after handling. Do not eat, drink or smoke while handling.

D. Technical recommendations to prevent environmental risks:

Keep away from incompatibles such as oxidizing agents and alkalis; avoid discharge to drains.

SECTION 8: EXPOSURE CONTROLS / PERSONAL PROTECTION

8.1 Control parameters:

No specific occupational exposure limit is listed for sodium bisulphate under the Factories Act, 1948; control airborne dust levels below those causing irritation using local exhaust ventilation.

8.2 Appropriate engineering controls:

Use process enclosures, local exhaust ventilation, or other engineering controls to keep airborne levels below recommended exposure limits.

B. Respiratory protection:

Dust respirator; use an approved/certified respirator where ventilation is inadequate.

Splash goggles.

E. Bodily protection:

Lab coat/synthetic apron; full suit for large spills.

Reactive with oxidizing agents and alkalis. Do not mix with liquid chlorine bleach (hypochlorites), ammonia cleansers or similar products, or alcohols.

SECTION 11: TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

11.1 Information on toxicological effects:

In case of exposure that is repetitive, prolonged, or at concentrations higher than the recommended occupational exposure limits, adverse health effects may result depending on the means of exposure:

A. Ingestion (acute effect):

Causes gastrointestinal tract irritation and burns. Symptoms may include nausea and vomiting. May cause severe and permanent damage to the digestive tract.

B. Inhalation (acute effect):

Destructive to the mucous membranes of the upper respiratory tract. Causes irritation and chemical burns to the respiratory tract with burning pain in the nose and throat, coughing, wheezing, shortness of breath, and pulmonary oedema. Inhalation may be fatal in severe cases as a result of spasm, inflammation, oedema of the larynx and bronchi, and chemical pneumonitis.

C. Contact with skin and eyes (acute effect):

Can cause severe skin irritation or burns. Can cause severe irritation or burns of the eyes; corneal damage or blindness possible.

D. CMR effects (carcinogenicity, mutagenicity, reproductive toxicity):

Carcinogenic effects: not available. Mutagenic effects: may affect genetic material (mutagenic for bacteria and/or yeast in in-vitro test systems); not classified as a human mutagen based on available data. Reproductive/developmental toxicity: not available.

Destructive to mucous membranes of the upper respiratory tract on inhalation of dust.
