Relevant uses: Sequestrant/chelating agent, water softening, dispersing agent for clays and pigments, scale & corrosion inhibitor in boiler and cooling water treatment, detergent builder, and (food-grade material only, subject to end-user compliance) permitted food additive. For industrial user only.
Uses advised against: All uses not specified in this section or in section 7.3.

SECTION 2: HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

2.1 Classification of the substance or mixture:

2.3 Other hazards which do not result in classification:

Dry material may cause foreign-body irritation in the eyes. Prolonged contact with the dry material may cause drying or chapping of the skin. Not expected to produce significant environmental effects when used as recommended.

SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of necessary first-aid measures:

This product has low oral toxicity and is minimally irritating to skin and eyes; treatment is controlled removal from exposure with symptomatic and supportive care.

By inhalation:

Remove to fresh air immediately. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Inhalation of the dust may cause coughing and sneezing; get medical attention if symptoms persist.

By skin contact:

Wash with plenty of water. Prolonged contact with the dry material may cause drying or chapping of the skin. Get medical attention if irritation develops.

By eye contact:

Rinse immediately with plenty of water. The dry material may cause foreign-body irritation in some individuals. Get medical attention if irritation occurs and persists.

By ingestion/aspiration:

Drink plenty of water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. No significant adverse health effects are expected if only a small amount (less than a mouthful) is swallowed.

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1 Suitable extinguishing media:

Suitable: Product is non-combustible – use extinguishing media appropriate to the surrounding fire (water spray/fog, foam, dry chemical powder, carbon dioxide).

5.2 Specific hazards arising from the chemical:

Non-combustible. No special fire or explosion hazards are known for this product.

7.1 Precautions for safe handling:

A. General precautions for safe use:

Good industrial practice in housekeeping and personal hygiene should be followed. Avoid contact with eyes and skin. Wash hands immediately after handling. Remove material from clothing.

B. Technical recommendations for the prevention of fires and explosions:

Not applicable – product is non-combustible.

C. Technical recommendations on general occupational hygiene:

Do not eat or drink during handling; wash hands after handling.

D. Technical recommendations to prevent environmental risks:

8.2 Appropriate engineering controls:

Provide local exhaust ventilation where dust may be generated, to keep airborne concentrations below the occupational exposure limits, in addition to individual PPE as needed.

SECTION 10: STABILITY AND REACTIVITY

10.1 Reactivity:

No specific reactivity hazards known under normal conditions of storage, handling and use.

10.2 Chemical stability:

Chemically stable under the indicated conditions of storage, handling and use. Solutions of this product hydrolyse over time to form ortho-phosphate and other shorter-chain phosphates; hydrolysis is accelerated by temperature and pH of the system.

10.3 Possibility of hazardous reactions:

Under the specified conditions, hazardous reactions are not expected.

10.5 Incompatible materials:

No specific material to avoid; keep away from excessive moisture.

Oxides of phosphorus (on thermal decomposition at high temperature).

SECTION 11: TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

11.1 Information on toxicological effects:

In case of exposure that is repetitive, prolonged, or at concentrations higher than the recommended occupational exposure limits, adverse health effects may result depending on the means of exposure:

A. Ingestion (acute effect):

Low oral toxicity. No significant adverse health effects expected if only a small amount is swallowed.

B. Inhalation (acute effect):

Inhalation of dust may cause coughing and sneezing/respiratory irritation.

C. Contact with skin and eyes (acute effect):

Minimally irritating; prolonged contact with the dry material may cause drying/chapping of skin; dry material may cause foreign-body irritation of the eyes.

D. CMR effects (carcinogenicity, mutagenicity, reproductive toxicity):

No adverse effects on reproductive capacity were reported in a multigenerational rat study. No increase in tumours was reported in a 2-year rat feeding study. Classification criteria for carcinogenicity and mutagenicity are not met based on available data.

E. Sensitizing effects:

Classification criteria for respiratory or skin sensitisation are not met based on available data.

F. Specific target organ toxicity (STOT) – single exposure:

May cause respiratory irritation (see Section 2).

G. Specific target organ toxicity (STOT) – repeated exposure:

Rats fed this material in the diet for one month showed decreased growth and increased kidney, lung and spleen weight with kidney damage; rats fed for two years showed decreased weight gain, increased kidney weight and kidney changes.

H. Aspiration hazard:

Classification criteria are not met based on available data.
